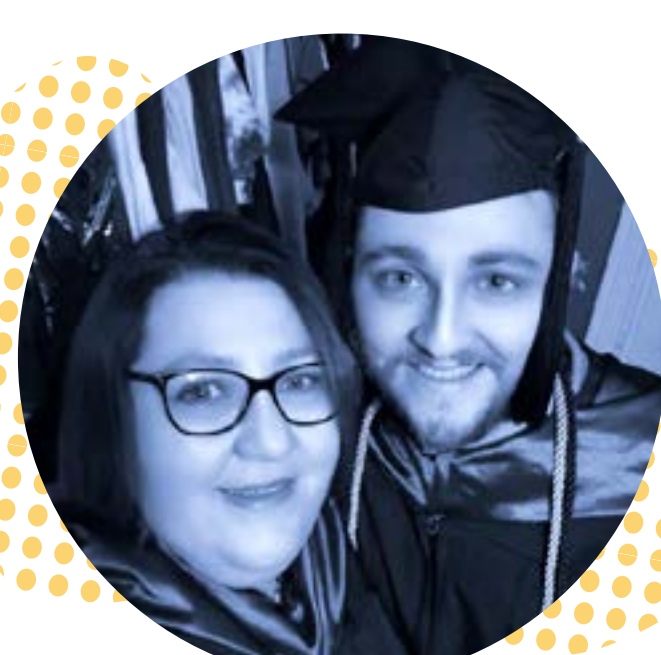
Calvin Moses | 2021
